Ass. Prof. of History of International Relations, Director of CEMAS - Research Center "Cooperation with Eurasia, Mediterranean and Africa of Sub-Sahara, at the Sapienza **University of Rome** 

Prof. Andrea Carteny holds a PhD in History of Europe at Sapienza University. He is skilled in National Identities and Symbols, Political Science, Analytical Skills, Lecturing, and International Relations. His fields of research include: Nationalism and Communism, Nationalism and transition to democracy, ethnic and civic nationalism, comparative regional nationalisms in Western and Eastern Europe.

He is research coordinator of the "5+5" Defence Initiative 2018 on Maritime Security Borders and Migrants.

Prof. Nadan Petrovic holds a Ph.D. in "History of Asylum in Italy since Constitution form 1948, in light of process of harmonization of EU policies in asylum" and a Master's in International Protection of Human Rights at "La Sapienza", as well as Law Degree from the University of Sarajevo. During his professional career, he covered several high-ranking positions such as: Director at the Italian Ministry of Integration; Director of the Central Service of the Italian National System for Protection of Asylum Seekers and Refugees (SPRAR); Advisor to the Director General for Development Cooperation of the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

### Ass. Prof. of Social psychology and Peace psychology at Sapienza University of Rome

Prof. Mauro Sarrica holds a PhD in Personality and Social Psychology. His main interests are in the social construction of knowledge, the stability and change of social beliefs, and in peace psychology. His studies focus mainly on how people interpret and co-construct social reality in order to face changes and new situations. From this perspective, he participated in and led national and cross-national research projects on the social representation of sustainable energy, long term effects of large infrastructure projects on local communities, Information and Communication Technologies for Development, the impact of the Internet on journalists' practices, social representations of peace and memory in new generations.
